Iambic Trimeter: 3 iambic metra = 6 iambic feet (pure iamb = \cup –) General Scheme: $x - \cup - | x - \cup - | x - \cup - (x = anceps or "doubtful" syllable)$

- $x = \cup or -$
- $-=-or \cup \cup (resolution)$
- the final (i.e. 12th) element in a line always counts as a single long (whether long or short)

In Seneca, the 9^{th} element (i.e. at the beginning of the 3rd metron) is almost always long, and so the scheme is:

$$x - U - |x - U - | - - U -$$

Note also:

- word-end is usual after the 5^{th} element (i.e. at the beginning of the 2^{nd} metron) = the main break
- note that the final and defining rhythm of the line is a cretic $(- \cup -)$
